



Minutes of May 18, 1988 - Regular Meeting

Present: Spangler, Cosgrove, Miller, Yonker, Humenick

President Spangler opened the meeting at 7:07 P.M.

Reading of the minutes of the April 20, 1988 meeting were dispensed with because of the necessity of keeping this meeting short.

Treasurer's report was given and accepted.

Bills for payment were presented and approved for payment.

Road Report

Bob Reeder, Paving superintendent, Had a contractor look at our road and asked for a price for both Slurry Coating and Chip and Seal. To bring our roads up to tip-top condition would entail tearing up the present roadway and starting from scratch. Chip and seal will not make the road like new. The road would still have bumps and we would still have to deal with alligating and potholes. One possibility for improvement would be a one inch overlay at \$60,000 per mile. Slurry or chip and seal. Slurry is cheaper and looks better than chip and seal. A recommendation was made to investigate the possibility of our tearing up the road with our own equipment and then having a contractor come in and lay a new roadbed and chip and seal it. No conclusions were made as to what course we should follow.

Bob Yonker was commissioned to look into the pricing of caps to be presented to all volunteer road workers.

A motion was made by Bill Humenick to increase the petty cash fund by \$500.00. It was seconded by Don Cosgrove and passed unanimously.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:27 P.M.
